

SUMMER TERM WORK INTERNSHIP - DAIRY

WHO WE ARE

Perrotis College, located on the beautiful American Farm School campus, is a dynamic fusion of its historic past and vibrant present.

A green oasis surrounded by a semi-urban environment, the college is located minutes outside Greece's second largest city, Thessaloniki. The campus has grown from its first 50 acres in 1904 to its current size of 280 acres.

Today, the American Farm School serves all educational divisions, from Pre-k to graduate level. Perrotis College, founded in 1996, now offers 5 bachelor and 3 master's degrees.



INTERNSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

Our work internship allows students to gain practical insight into Greek animal production.

Dairy farm: Interns learn to recognize basic bovine illnesses, manage calves, deal with milking, feeding and handling feed-stuff, as well as gain an introduction to artificial insemination.

Dairy plant: Interns are part of a team producing dairy products in a modern food processing unit where they clean and disinfect the premises and equipment, pasteurize and bottle fresh milk, as well as produce products including cream, butter yogurt and semi-hard cheese. They also conduct lab analyses of raw materials and dairy products.

Students can earn up to 6 credits. A no credit option is also available.

PROGRAM DETAILS



Your day starts at 6 am to take advantage of cooler morning temperatures. Expect to work until 11. The work week is Monday through Thursday, allowing you the opportunity to explore Greece in your free time. Each afternoon, interns will be briefed regarding the following day. You will be responsible for submitting a project at the end of the program. Recent topics have included "Comparative Analysis of Livestock Waste Management Techniques and their Environmental Influence" and "The Impact of Milk Product Substitutes on Human Health."

You will also take Greek Cultural Experience, which provides an overview of Greek life and includes two hours of Greek language instruction a week.

Keep your schedule open because field trips and excursions are organized throughout the program to places like Athens, Mount Olympus and the Sporades islands.
